Abstract

Everyday Activism in Archaeology

This article examines the term 'activism' and how it may be applied within the archaeological everyday practice through 'micro-actions'. The contemporary world is undergoing critical changes and thus terms like 'sustainability', 'activism' and 'ethics' have become relevant to archaeology. But how can archaeologists attribute to a progressive and positive development of the world in our day-to-day practice? I suggest that we look towards the ethics of speculative knowledge production from where excavators, teachers and disseminators can ask questions while encountering the world.
